

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (GENERAL PERMITTED DEVELOPMENT) (ENGLAND) ORDER 2015 (AS AMENDED)

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF A DIRECTION UNDER ARTICLE 4(1) TO WHICH PARAGRAPHS 1(9), 1(10) AND 2(6) OF SCHEDULE 3 APPLY

BASSETLAW DISTRICT COUNCIL (FORMER NORTH BORDER INFANTS AND NURSERY SCHOOL AND FORMER SERLBY PARK ACADEMY PRIMARY SCHOOL, BIRCOTES) ARTICLE 4(1) DIRECTION – 21^{ST} JUNE 2018

The Article 4(1) Direction was confirmed on the 21st June 2018, following approval from the Council's Planning Committee on the 20th June 2018.

With reference to the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015, as amended, this Direction applies to the following types of development:

Schedule 2, Part 2 – Minor Works

Class C - Exterior Painting

The painting of any part of the external brickwork or stone dressings.

• Schedule 2, Part 11 - Heritage and Demolition

Class B - Demolition of Buildings

Any building operation consisting of the demolition of a building which is coloured red on the map.

Class C - demolition of gates, fences, walls etc

Any building operation consisting of the demolition of the whole or any part of any gate, fence or railings fronting Shrewsbury Road and Snipe Park Road.

The Direction removes permitted development rights for the types of development listed above, effective from the date the Direction was confirmed (i.e. 21st June 2018). Planning Permission is therefore be required for any of the above types of development.
